Lineup Announcement SPRING FESTIVAL IN TOKYO 2023 18 March to 16 April 2023

The Spring Festival in Tokyo Executive Committee (President: Koichi Suzuki) is glad to announce that one of Japan's biggest classic music festival "Spring Festival in Tokyo 2023" will be held in Ueno, Tokyo, an area famous for its beautiful cherry blossoms in spring and its historical and cultural attractions from March 18th through April 16th 2023. The festival comprises various concerts – including opera (concert style), orchestra concerts, chamber music concerts, and lieder concerts which will be held not only in concert halls but also in museums and various places in Ueno Park.

The festival, now in its 19th year, will open with the Italian Opera Academy by Riccardo Muti and chamber music by members of Berliner Philharmoniker. The Tokyo-HARUSAI Wagner Series will feature Die Meistersinger von Nürnberg with the NHK Symphony Orchestra under the baton of Marek Janowski, and the Tokyo-HARUSAI Choral Works Series by the Tokyo Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra and Tokyo Opera Singers will present Ein Deutsches Requiem with conductor Finnegan Downie Dear, winner of the Gustav Mahler Conducting Competition 2020. The Tokyo-HARUSAI Puccini Series with the Yomiuri Nippon Symphony Orchestra will present Tosca. In addition to the Richard Wagner for Kids program in cooperation with the Bayreuth Festival in Germany, chamber music and recitals by leading domestic and international artists as well as popular museum concerts are planned. The Concerts in Harmony with Cherry Blossoms in Ueno will also return to add color to Ueno Park, which will celebrate its 150th anniversary in 2023.

■Highlights of "Spring Festival in Tokyo 2023"

Spring is the time when artists dominating the world stage come together in Tokyo

The Spring Festival in Tokyo 2023 will present three operas in concert style, beginning with Verdi's *Un ballo in maschera* by Riccardo Muti as part of the **Italian Opera Academy in Tokyo**, to explore the composers' thoughts. At the Italian Opera Academy, maestro Muti will also teach young musicians the secrets of Verdi through 10 days of lectures, commentary on works, and performances by the students. The **Tokyo-HARUSAI Wagner Series** will feature the masterpiece *Die Meistersinger von Nürnberg* (conductor Marek Janowski; NHK Symphony Orchestra), while the **Tokyo-HARUSAI Puccini Series** will present *Tosca* (conductor Frédéric Chaslin; Yomiuri Nippon Symphony Orchestra) with the best possible cast. The Bryn Terfel Opera Night will also be held (postponed performance of the 2022 show). The chamber music will also feature some of the most popular pianists and accomplished artists of the day.

A variety of series unique to the Spring Festival in Tokyo

One of the unique attractions of the Spring Festival in Tokyo is that it brings together world-renowned soloists and selected brilliant artists from Japan's leading orchestras, providing a one-of-a-kind musical experience. The festival will present a wide variety of themes and compositions, from classical to contemporary, with all the allure of the music. In the **Tokyo-HARUSAI Choral Works Series**, Finnegan Downie Dear will make his Japan debut, leading the Tokyo Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra in *Ein Deutsches Requiem*. The **Tokyo-HARUSAI Lieder Series**, the unique **Tokyo-HARUSAI Marathon Concert** and the **Tokyo-HARUSAI Discovery Series** are also not to be missed.

Museum concerts at art galleries and museums in Ueno Park

The popular **museum concerts** held in the exhibition rooms and halls of art galleries and museums will also be more powerful than ever. At the National Museum of Nature and Science, leading Japanese artists will perform at various locations for each performance, while at the Tokyo National Museum, the program will feature a series of works by J.S. Bach, the sacred works of classical music. A variety of unique performances, including collaborations with special exhibitions at the Tokyo Metropolitan Art Museum and other venues, along with the VOCA exhibition at the Ueno Royal Museum, will make people want to visit again and again.

Tokyo-HARUSAI for Kids will provide an opportunity for children to encounter opera and classical music during spring break

There are also a variety of events for children. **Richard Wagner for Kids**, cooperated with the Bayreuth Festival, will present a familiar arrangement of *Die Meistersinger von Nürnberg*, while the popular annual **Picture Book** and **Music for Children** event and **Open Rehearsals** will be held to convey the appeal of classical music to children of all ages.

<u>Ueno Park's 150th anniversary – Vibrant events such as Concerts in Harmony with Cherry Blossoms</u> <u>will return</u>

Concerts in Harmony with Cherry Blossoms will return to Ueno Park, which will celebrate its 150th anniversary in 2023. Free mini-concerts will be held daily not only in Ueno but also at various locations around Tokyo. Be sure to check the festival's official website for the schedule!

Live streaming with high image and sound quality (for a fee)

Those who are unable to visit the festival will still have a chance to enjoy the performances at the Spring Festival in Tokyo. As in the past, live streaming will continue to be provided with **high sound quality, high image quality, and free-viewpoint video**. A useful app will also continue to be available. Enjoy the realistic feel of live streaming from wherever you are.



Exceptional classical music performed by top-notch domestic and international artists, including opera, orchestra, and chamber music

● The Italian Opera Academy in Tokyo by maestro **Riccardo Muti** started in 2019. The third edition of the academy in 2023 will feature Verdi's *Un ballo in maschera*. On the first day of the academy, the maestro will explain the essence and allure of the work, making it a must-see event for music fans. Next spring, applications for Listners (Student) will once again be accepted. (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Main Hall / etc., March 18 - April 1)

The Tokyo-HARUSAI Wagner Series will present the masterpiece *Die Meistersinger von Nürnberg* with the NHK Symphony Orchestra under the baton of German master Marek Janowski, a familiar face in this series. David Butt Philip as Walther, and bass-baritone Egils Silins, a familiar face at the Bayreuth Festival and at the forefront of Wagner productions around the world, will be in the spotlight. (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Main Hall, April 6, 9)

3 The Tokyo-HARUSAI Puccini Series with the **Yomiuri Nippon Symphony Orchestra** will present *Tosca* by Frederic Chaslin, a conductor who is in great demand in Vienna, New York and elsewhere on the world stage (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Main Hall, April 13, 16). In addition to **Bryn Terfel**, one of the best singers of our time, playing his specialty Scarpia, and **Krassimira Stoyanova** playing Tosca, the singers include many stars who have made their mark on the world stage. Terfel will also hold his Opera Night with the **Tokyo Symphony Orchestra** under the baton of **Ryusuke Numajiri**. (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Main Hall, April 5) This special stage performance is also a must-see.

• The appearance of world-class artists of the day is also not to be missed. Kit Armstrong (*piano*) will play 500 years of keyboard music in five days, (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, April 1, 4, 6, 8, 10) and Jan Lisiecki (*piano*) will present an all-Chopin program, which is his specialty. (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, April 5, 7)

6 Naoka Aoki (*violin*), who has been in the spotlight since her appointment as concertmistress of Münchner Philharmoniker, will appear with her Munich colleagues. (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, April 13) The baroque ensemble formed by hornist Nobuaki Fukukawa with Masamitsu Sannomiya and others will also make an appearance, (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, March 24) and world-renowned oboe player Mizuho Yoshii will perform with the Verus String Quartet for the first time. (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, April 2) Expectations are high for the collaboration of these talented artists.

G Legends of the Japanese music scene will also make appearances. Masafumi Hori will lead the Tokyo-HARUSAI Chamber Orchestra with young and talented artists, (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, March 21) and Teiko Maebashi will appear with Sadao Harada and others in a quartet to earnestly face Beethoven, the sage of music. (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, March 30) Veteran artists such as Yo Kigoshi and Tomoko Kato will present Schubert's Chamber Music with artists who will lead the next generation. (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, March 27)

The high-acclaimed Chamber Music with Members of the **Berliner Philharmoniker** will bring together topclass performers including **Daishin Kashimoto** (*first concertmaster*), **Amihai Grosz** (*principal viola*), **Olaf Maninger** (*solo cellist*), and **Ohad Ben-Ari** (*piano*). (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, March 18) Olaf Maninger will also give a solo recital. (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, March 19)

The festival also features a number of series that have been well-received each spring: The Finest Chamber Music Played by Brilliant Musicians by Yomiuri Nippon Symphony Orchestra concertmaster Kota Nagahara and others; (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, April 3) Brahms's Chamber Music led by Yoshiko Kawamoto and Kaeko Mukoyama; (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, April 5) Tokyo-HARUSAI 〈Geist und Kunst〉 Chamber Series by Sunao Goko and Hiroshi Kato; (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, April 11) Trio Accord - Kei Shirai (violin), Hiroki Kadowaki (cello), and Yuya Tsuda (piano), celebrating their 20th anniversary; (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, April 15) Japanese Songs by Tokyo Opera Singers and Rikuya Terashima; (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, March 22) and Chamber Music with Members of the NHK Symphony Orchestra featuring a string ensemble led by Ryoichi Fujimori. (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, March 22)

 At Sogakudo of the Former Tokyo Music School, Piano Duo Takahashi | Lehmann will perform the Brandenburg Concertos, (March 18) Yayoi Toda will perform the Complete Ysaÿe's Sonatas for Violin Solo, (April 1) Finnish Radio Symphony Orchestra principal flutist Yuki Koyama will perform on the theme of Japan and Finland, (April 8) and Vitaly Yushmanov (baritone) will feature Yoshinao Nakada on the centenary of his birth. (April 14)

• The Tokyo-HARUSAI Choral Works Series with orchestra (Tokyo Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra) and chorus (Tokyo Opera Singers) will present Brahms's *Ein Deutsches Requiem* with Finnegan Downie Dear, who won first prize at the Gustav Mahler Conducting Competition 2020, making his Japan debut. (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Main Hall, April 8)

2 In the Tokyo-HARUSAI Lieder Series, **Tareq Nazmi** (*bass*), who has been dramatically expanding his activities on the world stage with Berliner Philharmoniker and others, and whose famous performance of *Lohengrin* at the Spring Festival in Tokyo 2022 is still fresh in our minds, will perform *Winterreise* with the virtuoso Gerold Huber. (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, March 23)

3 Composer/pianist **Masanori Kato** will present the final installment of The World of Benjamin Britten, a fivepart series that unravels the appeal of British composer Britten. In addition to *Symphony for Cello and Orchestra* featuring NHK Symphony Orchestra principal cellist **Rei Tsujimoto** as soloist, *The Young Person's Guide to the Orchestra* featuring actress **Tomoko Nakajima** as narrator will also be presented. (Sogakudo Concert Hall, Tokyo University of the Arts, April 2)

④ In conjunction with the 150th anniversary of the opening of Ueno Park, the annual Tokyo-HARUSAI Marathon Concert will feature small chamber music and a talk by Masayasu Komiya, who will discuss Europe from the 18th to 20th centuries, under the title of The European Style of Gathering : Music, Parks, Exhibitions. (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, March 25)

6 The Tokyo-HARUSAI Discovery Series, which offers a fascinating new encounter with a composer, will feature Czech composer Bohuslav Martinů. (Tokyo Bunka Kaikan Recital Hall, March 29)

 Many outstanding artists from Japan and abroad will perform, including Mie Kobayashi, Tomomi Shinozaki, Tatsuya Yabe, Akira Mizutani, Gen Yokosaka, Wen-Shin Yang, Anna Hashimoto, Aki Matsui, Ryosuke Suho, Naruhiko Kawaguchi, Ayano Kamimura, Kikuko Ogura, and LEO.

Museum Concerts, a collaborative project with art galleries and museums in Ueno Park

With an intimate atmosphere, museum concerts are filled with a different kind of charm from those held in concert halls. The collaboration project featuring special exhibitions offers a rare opportunity to experience the breath of the artists who lived in that era.

At the venues, which also house important cultural properties, young artists from Japan and abroad as well as talented artists from around the world will hold concerts

that align with the characteristics of individual special exhibitions and venues in the majestic spaces of art galleries and museums.

Tokyo-HARUSAI For Kids

The Tokyo- HARUSAI for Kids is a program especially for children who may not have many opportunities of coming in contact with live music, such as those who have yet to start school or those in junior high or high schools. Richard Wagner for Kids *Die Meistersinger von Nürnberg* which is a production in cooperation with the Bayreuth Festival is directed by **Katharina Wagner**. Picture Book and Music for Children will be performed with commentaries. Also, Open Rehearsals of opera and orchestra concert will be held.

Ueno Park's 150th Anniversary - Vibrant events such as Concerts in Harmony with Cherry Blossoms will return

The Concerts in Harmony with Cherry Blossoms, which could not be held due to the COVID-19 pandemic, will finally return. Free mini-concerts will be held in Ueno Park and other locations around Tokyo every day. Details will be announced on the official website once available.

Live streaming with high image and sound quality (for a fee)

Following on from this past spring, Spring Festival in Tokyo LIVE Streaming 2023 will allow those unable to visit the venue to enjoy live streaming of the festival performances with high sound quality, high image quality, and free-viewpoint video on their home computers or on their tablets or smartphones while traveling. Tokyo-HARUSAI App launched in 2022 will also continue to be available, allowing users to enjoy the performances more closely.

Instructions for purchasing tickets for distribution and viewing will be announced around February 2023.







■MAP of Ueno Park

Founded in 1872, the Tokyo National Museum collects, houses, and displays the most comprehensive collection of artworks and antiquities from Japan as well as other Asian countries, while also conducting research and providing educational programs. The museum houses over 110,000 items of cultural properties and consists of six galleries: Honkan, Toyokan, Heiseikan, the Gallery of Horyuji Treasures, Hyokeikan, and Kuroda Memorial Hall.	Since its establishment in 1926, the Tokyo Metropolitan Art Museum has been a shrine of fine arts, hosting various exhibitions of masterpieces by past and present masters and trendsetting foreign arts. The museum aspires to be a "doorway to art" and strives to become "a haven for enrichment of the heart".
